ON JANUARY 15, 1867, A TRANSPORTATION REQUEST WAS MADE TO MAJ. GEN. OLIVER OTIS HOWARD, COMMISSIONER OF THE FREEDMEN'S BUREAU, TO TRANSPORT 435 FREED MEN, WOMEN AND CHILDREN FROM KINGSTREE IN WILLIAMSBURG COUNTY, SOUTH CAROLINA TO CHARLESTON, SOUTH CAROLINA THEN ON TO GALVESTON, TEXAS. THE JOURNEY WAS MADE BY SHIP AND THESE FORMERLY ENSLAVED PEOPLE WERE ULTIMATELY TRANSPORTED TO FALLS COUNTY, TEXAS TO WORK UNDER FREEDMEN'S BUREAU LABOR CONTRACTS.
